# Letter from the CEO

Dear Grace family, friends and community partners,

2020 was a memorable year as we celebrated Grace Medical Home's 10th anniversary. We celebrated our first year in the new location, a wonderful facility that nourishes and thrives on collaboration and integrates services to enhance the patient experience. The Dental Center continued to grow serving more patients, recruiting additional volunteers, and adding new services.

Despite the pandemic, Grace welcomed 200 new volunteers who, along with our longtime volunteers, donated more than 24,000 service hours to deliver care to our patients.

The significance and value of Grace Medical Home's mission has never been more relevant than it is today – especially in the midst of a global pandemic. The need for Grace is overwhelming. In 2020, our already vulnerable patients were thrust into survival mode six months into the pandemic:

- 3/4 of our patients who were working at the start of the pandemic had their hours/pay reduced by a significant amount
- 53% of families with two incomes had BOTH people lose most or all of their income or work hours

Grace was there for them literally and virtually. Thanks to a partnership with Orange County, we met our patients in their homes via telemedicine. We wore masks to protect ourselves and others, took our temperature and practiced social distancing. We continued to show up, day in and day out, to serve our patients.

Another constant was our faith and trust in God. He provided the staff, volunteers, funding partners, opportunities, and the services - in big ways and small - to meet the needs of the uninsured. We call them "God sightings." We see them happen on a daily basis and they serve as reminders that God is propelling our journey forward, one step at a time.

Thank you for your steadfast support of Grace Medical Home's mission and vision. We look forward to continuing walking alongside you as we see to it that no one misses the grace of God.

The UCF College of Medicine partnered with Grace to establish the KNIGHTS Clinic. Held twice a month at Grace, the clinic is coordinated by medical students from the UCF College of Medicine and staffed by students, faculty and physician volunteers under the guided supervision of licensed practitioners.

#### 2015

The first Worship Service was held to share patient testimonials and the impact of Grace.

#### 2017

Through a clinical trial in partnership with Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida and Direct Relief, we provided healthy food boxes to our Diabetes Prevention Program participants.

#### 2020

Amid a global pandemic, Grace celebrated our 10th Anniversary of gratitude and growth.

# Grace Medical Home at a Glance



# Dental Center's First Year of Service

The Dental Center continued to grow by serving more patients, recruiting additional volunteers, and adding new services including exams, radiographs, hygiene visits, restorative fillings, root canals, crowns, and removable prosthetics.



## **UCF** Pre-Dental Association

We have an ongoing partnership with the University of Central Florida Pre-Dental Student Association. Students participate in all clinic duties, including helping to schedule patients, assist with procedures, and sterilize equipment. Pre-dental students gain valuable dental clinic experience. They are introduced to an underserved population with the hope that when they become providers, they will in turn give back to the community.

## Dental Care Access Foundation

Grace partners with the Dental Care Access Foundation (DCAF) to help ease the emergency room visits of individuals with dental pain, infection and swelling. DCAF sees patients two Thursdays a month for scheduled clinics and also utilizes the clinic throughout the month to treat patients with emergencies.





# Food is Medicine

Food insecurity soared in 2020. In partnership with Second Harvest Food Bank and funded by the Orlando Magic Youth Foundation, "Food is Medicine for Healthier Kids," provides pediatric patients with comprehensive coaching, lifestyle classes, and access to healthy food boxes twice a month.

We added a full-time Mission Integration Director, Pastor Omar Cardona, to our staff to ensure spiritual care is at the foundation of every aspect of Grace.

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

# The Effects of COVID-19

Funded by a grant from Orange County Government, Grace launched telehealth services using Mend, a HIPAA-compliant platform for virtual appointments. This enabled Grace to overcome accessibility issues, provide continuity of both medical and mental health care and maintain our ongoing relationship and connection with our patients.



Our already vulnerable patients faced further social, economic and medical hardships. A comprehensive patient survey conducted in the fall illuminated the devastating impact the pandemic had on our patients:

For those who were working at the start of the pandemic:



**3/4** had their hours/pay reduced by a significant amount

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## More than half

of patients had to cut back or couldn't afford at least one basic need (food, rent, etc.)



**53%** of families with two incomes had BOTH people lose most/all of their income/work hours

**2/3** of patients worried about being evicted or having their utilities cut off



**One in six** patients were often worried about affording most or all of their basic needs

We screened every respondent for immediate and urgent social service needs and connected them with appropriate community resources.



# Finding Faith Through Grace: Domingo & Briseida's Story

As Central Florida slowly takes steps toward a semblance of normalcy, many families are still feeling the devastating impacts of the pandemic. For Domingo and his wife Briseida, the hard work continues to provide for their children.

"We both have lost our jobs due to COVID," shares Domingo. "I was a driver and my wife worked as a housekeeper in a hotel. We have been unable to find jobs in our field since we came to the United States, but we are not giving up."

Domingo and his family sought asylum in the United States several years ago, leaving behind professional careers as radio producers. They became patients at Grace when Briseida's brother told them about the clinic.

"It is not easy being an immigrant. There is a whole world of possibilities and instabilities," says Briseida. "When we decided to leave, there was so much uncertainty and fear – it was overwhelming. But we found Grace despite it all. We found people that cared and helped us find a way."

As patients at Grace, the couple not only receives medical care for their physical health but also their mental health through counseling and spiritual care. It wasn't until a wellness call from Pastor Omar, Grace's Director of Mission Integration, that the couple knew the service was offered.

"This counseling has saved our family in so many ways," Domingo said. "Every aspect of Grace has given us trust and confidence and renewed our belief that others genuinely care. Grace is an important part of us. Grace is part of our family. Grace is the hands of God on Earth – there is no better way to express it."

#### **SPA INVITATIONAL**


Though the Spa Invitational was cancelled due to the pandemic, committed donors provided \$80,000 to continue serving those in need.
